† Very Important Note re stamps: Do not remove stamps from their location!! Stamps can work one of three ways:

- 1. Stamp is affixed to a surface. **Do not peel off the stamp.** Press your inkpad against the stamp, then your passport against the stamp, and voilà! Stamp doesn't even move.
- 2. Stamp is loose. Pick up stamp, stamp passport, return stamp to original location.
- 3. Stamp is tied (via string) to something. Leave stamp on the string. Inkpad, stamp, passport... ¡Olé!






